Certify your garden. Habitat Heroes are individuals, organizations, and businesses who create habitat for planting native plants. Certifying your garden provides recognition to your work and inspires

SIMPLE STEPS TO CREATE A BIRD-FRIENDLY GARDEN

1. Select a site with adequate sun, soil, and drainage.
2. Thoroughly remove sod and weeds.
3. Plant a variety of shapes, sizes, and species.
4. Focus on plants that support high variety and quantity of food.
5. Plant in the spring or fall.
6. Pull out invasive weeds as your garden grows.
