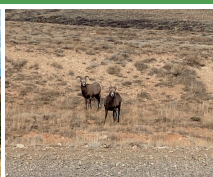

X-----SEMINOE STATE PARK-----



Nestled up against the base of the Seminoe Mountains at the North end of Seminoe Reservoir sits one of Wyoming's true treasures, Seminoe State Park. Located 35 miles north from Sinclair, Wyoming on Carbon County road 351, Seminoe State Park is known for its wide open water, local attractions and friendly atmosphere.

The Seminoe Mountains were the site for gold prospecting during the late 1800s. The name "Seminoe" is an Americanized spelling of the French name Cimineau. Basil Cimineau Lajeunesse was a French trapper in the area in the 1800s. Seminoe State Park was established in 1965.

X-----THINGS TO DO & SEE-----



The park and surrounding area offers recreation at its finest; camping, boating, swimming, fishing, hiking, ATV touring are all available within the immediate area. Wyoming wildlife is at its finest in and near Seminoe State Park. Patient visitors will be rewarded with a variety of animals passing by: big horn sheep, elk, mule deer, pronghorn, coyote, mountain lion, bobcat, fox, raccoon, skunk, jack rabbit and cottontail rabbit. Birders may glimpse eagles or other birds of prey plus many types of waterfowl and migratory birds. Bring your binoculars, sit back or go for a walk and enjoy!

FISHING



Seminole Reservoir offers great fishing for both trout and walleye. Both species inhabit the entire reservoir, though there are areas of greater concentration for each. State record walleye have been pulled from Seminole in years past. Good river fishing can be found a short drive from the park along the North Platte River from I-80 at Fort Fred Steele State Historic Site all the way to the Gray Reef Area below Alcova Dam. In between lies the famous "Miracle Mile," well-known for its blue ribbon fly fishing.

PARK RULES



- **A Complete list of Park Laws and Regulations is available at Kiosks and Park Headquarters**
- **Keep Vehicles on graveled areas, don't park on the grass**
- **No glass bottles, fireworks, or fire wood with nails**
- **Help to keep the park clean by putting trash in bins, not in the firepits or toilets**
- **Quiet hours are 10 P.M. to 6 A.M. - generators off**
- **Keep pets under control and clean up after them**
- **Obey signs, traffic barriers and speed limits**
- **No discharging of Firearms in park**
- **Camping is permitted for a maximum of 14 days in a 30 day period**
- **Put fires out with water not dirt**
- **Fishing and Boating are permitted subject to the regulations of the Wyoming Game and Fish Department**
- **Park dumpsters are for park use only; do not put fish parts in dumpsters**



RESERVATIONS & FEES

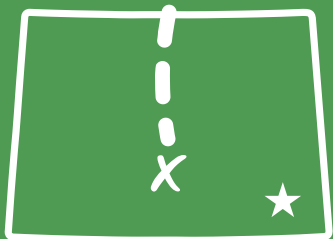


Reservations are required from May 1st through October 31st for all camping. If sharing campsites or "group sites" campers without the reservation pay camping fees at the fee kiosks upon arrival. During winter months, all park usage is first come, first served. Day use and camping fees shall be paid upon arrival at the entry fee kiosks.
